Dear Mr. Ford,

The Arizona Fraternal Order of Police (Arizona F.O.P.) is the largest law enforcement labor organization in the State of Arizona with approximately 6000 members. The Fraternal Order of Police Grand Lodge is the largest law enforcement organization in the country with over 306,000 members. I am writing this letter on behalf of all of the Arizona F.O.P. members and their families who have dedicated their lives to protecting and serving our state, counties, and local communities. The Arizona F.O.P. last year (June 2002) adopted a resolution stating that the F.O.P. recognizes that there is an inherent design flaw in the Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptor that causes the gas tank to explode upon rear impacts. Arizona lost three of its finest, Officer Juan Cruz, Floyd (Skip) Fink, and Robert Nielsen, to horrific and terrorizing deaths while trapped inside their burning Crown Victoria's. Arizona also had one of its finest, Jason Schechterle, terribly burned and disfigured when his Crown Victoria burst into flames upon being struck in a rear end collision.

The Arizona F.O.P. has never believed that the shielding of the fuel tank components on the Ford Crown Victoria was the proper response from the Ford Motor Company; we believe that redesigning and changing the placement of the fuel tank is the only way to solve the problem. The Arizona F.O.P. gave the Arizona Blue Ribbon Panel a chance to work with Ford to come up with practical solutions to the Ford Crown Victoria's fuel problem while Janet Napolitano served as the Attorney General. Unfortunately it appears that Ford is trying to take the cheapest and easiest way out of its responsibility to produce the safest vehicle possible and is shirking its moral obligation to our members in law enforcement. We now know that the shielding that your company placed on the Crown Victoria's has proven to be no fix at all. In just the month of May, Missouri Trooper Michael Newton and North Carolina Trooper Anthony Cogdill died horrific deaths in fiery rear end crashes and two other Ford Crown Victoria's burst into flames in rear end crashes but were unoccupied at the time. **All of these Crown Victoria's had the Ford recommended shielding installed and all caught fire upon rear end impact.** There have been 16 tragic deaths of law enforcement officers across the country since 1983 due to fires caused by rear end collisions to the Crown Victoria; several other officers have been seriously burned and nearly killed.

The Arizona State F.O.P. is calling upon our Governor and Attorney General to fight for the safety of the Arizona law enforcement officers across our state and to fight your company's reluctance to investigate other alternatives to make the Ford Crown Victoria a safer vehicle. We will not just sit by until another officer is either burned alive or severely injured due to Ford's reluctance to take the proper steps to protect law enforcement officers from the inherent design flaw in the Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptor. We depended on your company to help us in this fight to do the right thing and prevent any more horrific deaths, but you just turned a deaf ear to our calls for help. The Arizona Blue Ribbon Panel

has been ineffective to this point in convincing your company to modify the design and location of the fuel tank, add fuel bladders, incorporate designed trunk packs, or install fire suppression systems to all of the Crown Victoria Police Interceptors currently in service. Ford seems to be more worried about financial cost rather than human suffering; their faulty design has cost those officers, their families, and their fellow officers. We are calling on our Governor and Attorney General to look at every means to make you and the Ford Motor Company take responsibility and make the necessary corrections to ensure no other officers die or are injured in the fiery inferno that was once their Crown Victoria Police Interceptor. You and the Ford Motor Company must be held accountable and be made to take full responsibility for the design flaw and inaction up to now. It is a crime against humanity to know there are alternatives to save human lives from being burned alive and then fight against doing so just to save a few dollars.

The Arizona State Fraternal Order of Police is asking all of its members that drive gasoline Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptors to give great consideration before placing themselves in a position of being in a high-speed rear-end collision. Officers need to understand that the gasoline Ford Crown Victoria, even equipped with Ford recommended safety shields, may be a fiery inferno just waiting to happen. All law enforcement agencies and officers should take every precaution not to put their employees or themselves into an avoidable situation. The Arizona Fraternal Order of Police is calling on the Governor, Attorney General, all senators and representatives, all law enforcement agencies, and all officers to join in the fight to force Ford Motor Company to act responsibly.

The Arizona Fraternal Order of Police may be looking into a boycott of all Ford products and vehicles by all agencies, family members of officers, and the public in general as long as the Ford Motor Company refuses to take responsibility and make the Ford Crown Victoria a safe vehicle for law enforcement officers to drive. We cannot afford the preventable loss of another one of our finest. It is time to stop the needless carnage and death caused by the design flaw of your company's Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptor and to protect our members and fellow law enforcement officers not only in Arizona, but also across the country. We would like to have an honest answer as to why your company is unwilling to look at adding fire suppression to all of the new Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptors and retrofitting the Crown Victoria's on the street at this time. Ultimately, we would like Ford to redesign the gas tank placing it forward of the rear axle.
